Former Senator Paul Simon holds press conference

he 40th Annual Fall Conference was highlighted by an address by former Senator Paul Simon.

Joe Foote, Dean of the College of Mass Communication and Media Arts, gave the welcome before the keynote address by Scnator Simon. Simon is on the faculty at the School of Journalism at SIU and is head of the Public Policy Institute at SIU.

Senator Simon answered questions from the students concerning current events. Senator Simon shared his views on the degradation of politics and the role of the media its watchdog role.

Senator Simon said the thing that disturbed him the most about the Starr Report was that President Bill Clinton determined his actions based on the latest polls.

The Conference also featured a WSIU Studio Tour, a tour of the Daily Egyptian, newspaper critiques by Laurie Bielong, adviser at Belleville Township West, and yearbook critiques by Judy Vidakovich, adviser at Coulterville High School.

The Fall Conference Committee consisted of John Wells of Mater Dei High School Evansville, Andrea Clancy of Red Bud High School, and Herman Albers of Coulterville High
