SIUC site of April 19 conference

Preparations are being finalized for the 49th Annual SISPA Spring Conference to be held at SIU-Carbondale's Student Center on Monday, April 19.

Registration will be from 8-9 a.m. in the Gallery Lounge on the second floor of the Student Center.

Schools are urged to arrive early to take advantage of the displays and to register for the On-Site and Senior Interview contests.

Fees are \$4 per attendee for member schools. Additional fees are required for those students participating in the on-site contest. (See schedule at right for listing of ALL fees.) To participate, schools must be a part of SISPA.

PROGRAM

The opening assembly will begin at 9 a.m. At this time, Blue Banner, Golden Dozen and Yearbook Contest winners will be announced along with the Advisers of the Year.

First session discussions will be held from 9:40-10:20 a.m. The second session is slated from 10:30-11:10 a.m.

The On-Site Writing categories Caption Writing, Yearbook Feature Copy Writing, Yearbook Sports Copy Writing, Advertising Design and Editing will be from 9:40-10:20. The rest of the on-site contests will be from 9:40-11:10.

The afternoon assembly will begin at 12:45 p.m. with awards for yearbook photo and copy and Best Story awards for newspapers being presented. The On-Site Contest and Senior Interview winners will be announced at that time also. The conference will be completed by 1:30 p.m.

PARKING

Cars must park in the pay lost between the Student Center and the Stadium at 25 ¢per hour or park south of the arena.

A special lot for buses is available just south of the parking area across from the Student Center. Pick-up can be made at about 1:30 p.m. in front of the Student Center.

On-Site contest updated

The On-Site Writing Contests will again be offered at the Spring Conference.

Each SISPA member school may enter two students in each category.

Advisers should register students between 8-9 a.m. Each school may enter two students per category. A student may enter only one contest. There is a \$2 fee per entry.

Some categories will meet from 9:40-10:20. Students then may attend the second session of seminars. Other contests will last from 9:40-11:10.

Unless otherwise specified in the contest description, students are to bring only paper and a writing utensil. No typewriters, word processors or computers will be permitted. Also, no tape recorders will be allowed.

Descriptions of each of the contests is as follows:

 News Writing- Students will be given a fact sheet from which to draw information. Students will then compose a news story from information provided. (9:40-11:10)

- Editorial Writing- Students will be given a fact sheet from which to draw information. After reading the material, students will write an editorial on the topic using their ideas to support or oppose a position. (9:40-11:10)
- 3. Caption Writing- This contest is designed for both newspaper and yearbook staffs. Students will be given several photographs and will write captions. The captions must tell a complete story but not exceed 40 words in length. (9:40-10:20)
- 4. Yearbook Feature Copy Block-A fact sheet will be provided for those entered to write a typical feature copy block. (9:40-10:20)
- Yearbook Sports Copy Block-A fact sheet will be provided for those entered to write a typical sports copy block. (9:40-10:20)
- Yearbook Cover Design- Students will be asked to develop a cover idea based on a theme given to them.
 Students may bring out sheets, color pencils, markers etc. (9:40-11:10)
 - 7. Editing- Students will be asked

to proofread a story checking for good journalistic style. (9:40-10:20)

- Sports Writing- Students will be given a fact sheet from which to draw information. They will write a sports newspaper story based on those facts. (9:40-11:10)
- 9. Advertising Design- Students will be given three business information sheets. They will be asked to design ads to fit certain sizes. Students may bring a ruler and any type of pen or pencil. Artistic ability is not necessary as ads will be judged on overall design and areas may be simply marked for art work. (9:40-10:20)
- 10. Review Writing- Students will watch a short video-taped performance. They will write a review commenting on the performance. (9:40-11:10)
- 11. Senior Interview- Seniors will interview Glenn Poshard, former Illinois State Representative and gubernatorial candidate, and compose a feature story from information gathered during the interview. (9:40-11:10)

SISPA offers newspaper and yearbook competition in several categories. The newspaper competition includes the Blue Banner award for overall excellence. Individual staff members can compete in over 20 different newspaper writing categories.

Overall yearbook competition includes the Golden Dozen award for overall excellence. Individual and staff competitions are also available for the yearbooks.

Along with these competitive events, on-site writing contests and a senior interview contest are offered at the Spring Conference.
