The 51st Annual SISPA Spring Conference will be held at SIU-Carbondale's Student Center on Wednesday, May 2.

Registration will be from 8-9 a.m. in the Gallery Lounge on the second floor of the Student Center.

Schools are urged to arrive early to take advantage of the displays and to register for the On-Site and Senior Interview contests.

Fees are \$4 per attendee for member schools. Additional fees are required for those students participating in the on-site contest. (See schedule at right for listing of ALL fees.)

To participate, schools must be a part of SISPA.

PROGRAM

The opening assembly will begin at 9 a.m. At this time, Blue Banner, Golden Dozen and Yearbook Contest winners will be announced

along with the Advisers of the Year.

First session discussions will be held from 9:40-10:20 a.m. The second session is slated from 10:30-11:10 a.m.

The On-Site Writing categories Caption Writing, Yearbook Feature Copy Writing, Yearbook Sports Copy Writing, Advertising Design and Editing will be from 9:40-10:20. The rest of the on-site contests will be from 9:40-11:10.

The afternoon assembly will begin at 12:30 p.m. with awards for yearbook photo and copy and Best Story awards for newspapers being presented.

The On-Site Contest and Senior Interview winners will be announced at that time also.

The conference will be completed by 1:30 p.m.

Paul Kowalczyk of SIUC to be interviewed by seniors

In the annual Senior Interview contest, seniors interview a noted figure from the Southern Illinois area and compose a feature story from the information gathered during the interview.

This contest takes place from 9:40-11:10 a.m.

This year's interviewee will be Mr. Paul Kowalczyk, the new athletic director for SIU at Carbondale.

Mr. Kowalczyk came from Northwestern University in Evanston, IL, where he was the associate athletic director. At Northwestern, the 42-year-old Kowalczyk helped to increase corporate sponsorship from \$588,000 to \$1.6 million in four years.

At SIU, Mr. Kowalczyk's priority is balancing the books. When he joined the Athletic Department last spring, it had a deficit of about \$800,000.

The Ohio native said in an article in April, 2000, in the *Daily Egyptian*, "The conviction and the passion for this institution just blows me away. It's stronger than what I've seen at Northwestern," he said.
