The 52nd annual Spring Conference saw a slight drop in overall attendance, but a significant increase in students participating in on-site writing contests.

as 2001, attended the conference with a total of 276 students.

Continuing to grow, the on-site contests hosted 130 entries.

Feature ideas important part of newspapers

Making a Difference

Coming up with creative, interesting feature ideas in all sections of the newspaper can make the difference between a mediocre publication and an outstanding one. Reporters and editors can apply a variety of techniques to develop such ideas.

- 1. Use those exchange issues you receive.** Assign an exchange editor who reviews each issue from another school and cuts out examples of good feature coverage and shares those ideas with fellow editors. Don't steal the ideas, but allow their creativity to enhance your own.
- 2. Assign story ideas as part of your staff.** When students are forced to look for ideas, they develop an eye and an ear for doing so. Divide the staff into thirds and collect ideas from each third every week. Spreading out the ideas will prevent everyone from turning in the same ideas on the same day.
- 3. If students are talking about it, they are interested in it.** Pay attention to what's going on around you. Conversations at lunch, discussions during class and talking in the hallway may lead to feature story ideas.
- 4. Allow your readers to have input.** Let them submit story ideas, and make it easy for them to do so.
- 5. A beat report system will generate dozens of good ideas for every issue.** In some cases, those beats will become stories. Assigning a student to cover a specific area of the school and submit a story every two, three or four weeks ensures that your staff is not letting great ideas slip by.
- 6. Make observations, and then discuss them when you return to your staff room.** Conduct a silent field trip. Have your staff or beginning journalism class walk—absolutely silently—through every hallway of the school. No doubt you will have seen activities and events that lead to feature story ideas.
