IHSA Journalism Competition Advisory committee to submit proposal

SISPA members Cathy Sullivan, Herman Albers, Dave Porreca and Laurie Bielong met on the campus of Eastern Illinois University on May 6 with EIHSPA (Eastern Illinois High School Press Association) director Dr. James Tidwell and IHSA assistant executive director James Lynn. In this meeting, plans were discussed about obtaining a journalism series in the Illinois High School Association.

Currently the IHSA hosts athletic events as well as contests in music, speech, theatre, debate and scholastic bowl.

The IHSA Board of Directors has now given approval to look into a statewide journalism contest.

The competition would be similar to the spring conference's on-site writing contest and would include sectional tournaments with winners advancing to a state tournament.

At the May 6 meeting, the group discussed the events, locations, rules, etc. By the end of the summer, a proposal to give to the IHSA Board of Directors should be in place.

The competitions which will be part of the proposal are listed to the right.

Each competing Illinois school will be able to enter two students per category.

The tentative times of the contests would be the last Saturday in April (sectional) and the first Saturday in May (state).

The competition would have two blocks of competing times, similar to the EIHSPA On-Site Writing Contest. This will allow students to compete in two events.

SISPA would continue to offer the on-site writing contests, aligning offerings to the state contests, to give students an opportunity to compete before the sectional competition.

If members would like to give any input into this process, they may contact any of the SISPA members who attended the meeting.

If the IHSA approves the proposal in September, the journalism series may be in place by next spring or in the spring of 2005. IHSA On-Site
