IHSA adopts journalism series

Competition to be started during the 2005-2006 school year

The Illinois HIgh School Association's Board of Directors approved a new state series in Journalism

beginning in the 2005-2006 school term at their April 27 board meeting.

The board added the

stipulation that the competition will be added only if 10 percent of IH A members participate. Currently

there are 761 member schools. In orderfor a state series to be implemented. at least 76 schools must be competing during the school term.

The News Media Advisory Committee developed the Terms and Conditions for the state series. The competition will conclude on the first Saturday in May.

14 schools participate 197 students attend Spring Conference

The 54th annual Spring Conference saw descrease in overall attendance.

Last year, 20 schools attended the conference with a total of 302 students.

Because of state testing and the number of conflicts which happen in April, advisers thought that holding the conference mid-year may help.

Consequently, a date in February has been chosen for the Spring Conference which will become the Winter Conference for 2005.

On Wednesday, Feb. 23,

SISPA will hold the Winter Conference in the SIU Carbondale Student Center.

The On-Site Writing Contests will highlight this conference as usual.

Sessions for both yearbook and newspaper will still be available looking at ways to improve publications yet during the school year.

During the advisers' meeting, critique sessions for publications were also suggested and will be considered for the Winter Conference.

The biggest change in

moving the conference will be the newspaper contests. Deadlines to judge Blue Banner and the Best Of Contest would have to be set too early to be announced in February.

Subsequently, the newspaper contests will have a due date in March and winners will be announced via the Editor. Plaques and certificates will be sent to schools.

The yearbook contests will run the same except for the 2005 Main-in Yearbook Contest which will be handled liked the newspaper contest.
